Cow Canyon Trading Post, built in the late 40's - early 50's, was brought back to life by owner Liza Doran and family in 1986.

It's a beautiful old building with a whole lot of soul. This handsomely restored post with its rough-hewn vigas and squeaky wooden floors charms everyone.

The Art of Navajo, Zuni, Hopi, and Bluff locals is carefully curated and displayed, representing the best work in about a 300-mile radius.
